# THIEVES FORCE ENTRANCE TO CABIN

## JOHN SIEGEL LOSES \$29 IN CASH, ROBBERS TURNING THE PLACE UPSIDE DOWN IN SEARCH.

A cabin in the rear of 1229 East Second street, occupied by John S. Siegel, was broken into early yesterday morning and ransacked from top to bottom, even the bed being turned topsy turvy in an effort to locate valuables. As it was the thieves secured \$29 in cash and some small trinkets. Several union cards in the organization of which Siegel is a member were also taken, but were found later lying along the railroad tracks.

Siegel, who is employed by the street railway company in the construction department, lives alone in the cabin, and when he arrived at home found that a side door had been forced with a chisel and the money, which had been placed in a wallet, gone.

Everything had been turned upside down and it took him some time to straighten the place up. The people living in the house at the front heard sounds such as might have been made by burglars, but as there was quite a lot of noise in the house at the time, music being enjoyed by the family and their guests, no attention was given to the sounds in the rear.

The police were informed and officers started to work on the case.
