

NEW ROOMING HOUSE TO BE OPENED AFTER JULY 5.

Dyckman Hotel Will Be Modern in Every Respect—Three Stories—50 Rooms.

After July 5 another rooming house will have been completed in Butte and added to the list of achievements and accomplishments in the building and real estate world in 1917.

The Dyckman rooming house, situated at 10 South Idaho street, will be opened on or after July 5. It contains 50 rooms, and one apartment, which will be occupied by the proprietors, Misses Thompson and Lano. The building is thoroughly modern in every respect, constructed of solid brick and tile. Hot and cold water facilities will be contained in every room, on the entire three floors.

The excavations were started three and a half months ago, and the finishing touches are now being put to the building, which is quite an addition to the block and to the city in general. A. Broadland was the contractor and the building was completed according to the plans prepared by the ladies themselves.

New Clinic Plans for Open House

Open house for doctors and their wives will be observed Sunday afternoon at the latest addition to Butte's facilities for treatment and care of the ill—the Casebeer Clinic, 11 South Idaho.

Invitations have been extended to 88 doctors in the Butte vicinity and their wives. Members of the medical profession will inspect the quarter-million dollar installation between 3 and 6 o'clock.

The first two floors of the building, the old Dyckman hotel, have been attractively remodeled and fitted with latest medical equipment. In the future, Dr. H. L. Casebeer, president of the clinic, intends to have the third (top) floor of the building remodeled to accommodate doctors who are practicing independently and desire office space there. Several doctors are members of the clinic staff.

Employed in the various departments of the clinic are the following: Business—Mrs. M. D. Lundwall, manager; Miss Jacqueline Thorpe, medical receptionist; Mrs. Fred Braus, secretary; Miss Marie King, secretary and stenographer; laboratory—Miss Marjorie Lowney, registered technician, in charge; hospital department—Mrs. Duane Cooper, in charge; clinical nursing — Mrs. Emmett Jennings and Mrs. William Kidd; optical—Richard Cornish, trained optician, in charge.

It was announced that the lot south of the clinic, once occupied by the Almira hotel which recently was razed, will be open daily to the public for parking.
